It commemorates the 150 miners who died in the Linby and Hucknall 1 and 2 collieries which were nearby. The last one shut in 1986 (from memory) and the town does not look to have recovered.







Back in Nottingham I met the others in Five Leaves Bookshop, found a book I wanted, then we trammed back to Toton. Then J realized she had left her Polar Bear blanket in Waterstone's - so guess where I am going tomorrow! Hannah headed up the motorway and home.

Every train between Ilkeston and Nottingham turns left at Trowell Junction, except the first train of the day which continues straight on and goes via Toton Yard and Beeston.
