

Time at Leeds to transfer to another TP unit, the train to Hull. This one was full and standing too - obviously hundreds of people with rail atlases to colour in. Having just done via Milford Junction to Castleford, the only new track this time was Milford Junction to Gascoigne Wood Junction.

I had texted Hannah to say I would be in Selby, and she came over to meet me. We drove into the town, found most of it was shut, visited Sainsburys for a loo and cat food, then popped into the Abbey to see the train in the stained glass window and have a cup of tea.

























Back at the station I joined the York train. This did the curve at Hambleton down onto the ECML, so that's the third piece I can colour in today. I worked on the theory that the Cross Country one I needed to go North would be behind us so I would have time to change platforms - I was correct. I hate Voyagers, but this one wasn't too full.

Another quick change at Newcastle, but the app said the Carlisle train was running late. I walked across the bridge, and was surprised my train was waiting. It sat there for 15 minutes no apology. Pretty dark by the time I got homeyou can tell the clocks have changed. Did I mention I managed to change the car clock?

The main Yorkshire gaps are now the Whitby line, the NYMR and other steam lines. Apperley Junction to Escholt Junction (Leeds to Ilkley), South Milford to Gascoigne Wood Junction, Selby to Temple Hirst Junction, Wakefield Glasshoughton to Castleford, Westgate to Kirkgate, Kirkgate to Hare Park Junction (Grand Central Bradford services not serving Pontefract). Calder Bridge to Turner's Lane (just outside Wakefield) is only done late night Friday and Sunday. Then over in north Lincolnshire I have the Barton-on-Humber branch and the main line Barnetby south to Lincoln. Looking north, the Bishop Auckland branch and the Darlington avoiding line (easiest done in the Up direction), Northalleton avoiding line (PSUL says best done on a Sunday), and the Newcastle bridges
